Mathematics 7 Course II

This course will prepare students for success in algebra and other secondary courses. The course focuses on basic problem solving skills while building a foundation in algebraic operations and functions, rational numbers, integers, equations and inequalities.

The seventh grade English course builds on the foundation begun in elementary school. This course will prepare the students for more advanced high school English studies. In grammar (Grammar and Composition I), the students will learn grammatical rules and master the skills needed to apply those rules in their writing and speaking. The procedures for writing outlines, summaries, book reports, and research papers will be taught and the student will be expected to produce examples of each. Literature (Of Places) contains selections that will help promote enthusiasm and interest for the junior high school student. Many of the selections will be assigned has homework to be discussed the next day in class, but some will be given has speed and comprehension quizzes during class time. Each lesson in Vocabulary, Spelling, Poetry I contains twenty spelling words and seven vocabulary words, with pronunciations, definitions, and sample sentences. All the spelling words are practical, and many are frequently misspelled. Many of the vocabulary words are taken from the stories in Of Places. Students will memorize nine poems over the course of the year. This memory work will help students to lay a foundation for future literature studies.

This course is written from the Christian perspective with the conviction that God is the Creator and Sustainer of the universe. Students are taught that man is to have dominion over the earth and with that responsibility comes the necessity of being good tenders, and managers of earth's resources. Science: Order and Design investigates fields such as botany, anatomy, zoology, and ecology with the goal of discovering the thoughts of the Creator through the ingenious structure and orderly function of His creation. Activity worksheets and labs (which include dissections of various plants and animals) are used as methods of review. Student will be expected to complete a scientific research paper and to do a six to eight week scientific investigation project. This course offers the student the freedom to study creation without the hindrance of false philosophies, greater insight into the marvels of creation, and an infallible source of truth – the Bible – with which to compare his/her observations.

This unique Bible curriculum deals with the relationships of life. Ships explores the relationship of the students to their home (kinship), the opposite sex (courtship), their peers (friendship), their school (scholarship), their church (fellowship), and with the Lord (lordship). As the students explore these major relationships, they will come to see how important each is in their own lives. They will learn that God's Word has clear instructions for how they should handle each relationship. The emphases of each lesson is to encourage teens to make personal applications to their lives, and to challenge them to become more Christ-like – physically, mentally, emotionally, and spiritually.
