Building on the foundation begun in elementary school, Grammar 8 begins to prepare students for more advanced high school English studies. Grammar and Composition II helps students to master the skills and to apply them in writing and speaking. The Literature selections in OF Places are designed to encourage the student to develop and maintain an enthusiastic enjoyment of reading. Most of the literature selections will be given has homework assignments and will have discussion questions that will be covered in class. Occasional surprise quizzes will be given over homework assignments. These are given to help keep the student accountable for the reading assignments. Students must become effective communicators and equally as important as using a good vocabulary is using correct spelling. Each lesson in Vocabulary, Spelling, Poetry II contains twenty spelling words and ten vocabulary words, with pronunciations, definitions, and sample sentences. All spelling words are practical and many frequently misspelled words are included in each list. Several of the vocabulary words are taken from the stories in Of Places.

SCIENCE
